Morehead City - Frank Kenneth Kyle, 92, of Morehead City, died Feb. 10, 2012, at Carolina East Medical Center.

He graduated from Rolla School of Mines with a civil engineering degree, law school at the University of Missouri-Kansas City and served during [World War II](#).
